

## Parent CODE OF CONDUCT POLICY

We, Front Royal Soccer Association (FRSA), have implemented the following Universal Parent Code of Conduct Policy, for the important message it holds about the proper role of parents in supporting their child in sports.

## GOOD SPORTMANSHIP is a MUST for ALL!

- Conduct yourself with honor and dignity at all times. (Your actions reflect on the team, club, community association, and soccer.)
- Parents will sit on the opposite side of their team and coaches.
- Be fair always no matter what the outcome.
- Know and obey the laws of the game.
- Work for the good of the team.
- Accept the decisions of the officials with good grace.
- Be generous when your team wins.
- Be graceful when your team loses.
- Believe in the honesty of your opponents.
- Let them play remember that you are not a player on this team.
- Support your team, coaches and representatives. (Discuss issues in private)
- Never encourage, condone or participate in any activities that may result in injuries to players and spectators, or result in damage to soccer facilities.
- Develop and encourage an appreciation of the game of Soccer.
- Abstain from the use of tobacco products and alcohol while in the presence of athletes.
- Support the soccer community.
- Failure to follow this code of conduct could result in penalties for your team or parents could be asked to leave.

The FRSA's Board of Directors and League Commissioners met and have come up with a Parent Conduct Policy if at any time a parent in negligent in the following of the FRSA PARENT CODE OF CONDUCT.

- 1. Verbal warning to stop and a written form will be placed in the FRSA files
- Any parent guilty of improper conduct at any game or practice will be asked to leave the sports facility and be suspended from the following game. Persons will be instructed to take and/or retaken the Positive Coaching Alliance Second Goal Parent: Developing Winners in Life through Sports course and provides a certificate to the league. This course is available online for \$30.00 at positivecoach.org.
- 3. Repeat violations will result in multiple game suspension, or the season forfeiture of the privilege of attending all games and their Player(s) may be released from the team and no longer be allowed to play for the remaining season.
